Paul Clark is regional president for the Northern Ohio and Cleveland region of National City, which is now part of PNC. Clark is a 34-year financial services veteran.

Clark joined National City in 1976 as a management trainee in Consumer Finance. He was later promoted to vice president of National City Bank and named senior vice president of Corporate Banking in 1989, a position through which he led Cleveland area lending from 1992-1995.

From 1995-97, Clark served as executive vice president of Retail Banking at National City Bank of Pennsylvania. In that role, he led the integration of Integra Financial Corporation into National City's Pennsylvania bank. He was later named president and chief executive officer of National City Bank of Michigan/Illinois following the merger of National City with First of America Bank Corporation. In 2000, Clark was appointed executive vice president of Institutional Asset Management and chairman of National City Investment Management Company until his appointment as president of Northern Ohio banking in 2004.

Clark is active in a number of civic and business organizations, serving on the boards of directors of the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland Foundation, Cleveland Institute of Art, Cleveland Rock and Roll, Inc., Great Lakes Science Center, One Community, Playhouse Square Foundation, the Union Club and The United Way of Greater Cleveland. He also co-chairs the Minority Business Growth Segment of the Greater Cleveland Partnership's Commission on Economic Inclusion.
